CHAPTER 14 HIS WAY, HIS TIME

When I was a small boy of about ten, long before I wanted to be a geologist, my father and mother took me on a trip to see the wonders of the Grand Canyon. I stood at the edge of a cliff and marveled at the colors of the rocks as I tried to focus my mind on the vast distance to the river below.
